

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EARLY INTERVENTION TRANSITION TO COMMONWEALTH COORDINATED CARE PLUS*

*This transition includes 700 children statewide

The Infant & Toddler Connection of Virginia team (local system managers, a provider, and state staff) is working with The Department of Medical Assistance Services (DMAS) and the six Commonwealth Coordinated Care Plus (CCC Plus) managed care organization (MCO) representatives on two major tasks. The tasks are:

Credentialing/Enrollment:

Credentialing and provider enrollment are currently in process. Local system managers and providers may have already been contacted by representatives of the health plans. If not, please talk with your local lead agency. Getting Early Intervention providers enrolled with each plan is an important step to ensure timely claims payment.

Training:

Training sessions are being planned for local system managers and service coordinators on CCC Plus requirements and to educate CCC Plus care coordinators about Part C Early Intervention services and requirements. It is expected that there will be a face to face component of the training and that these will be regional. Regional meetings will

allow service coordinators and care coordinators to meet each other and begin to establish relationships.
